REPORT on Scholarship Distribution Event - July 26th 2009

About Padala Charitable Trust (PCT)

PCT is a non-profit, non-government organization founded and registered in 2002. The primary goal of PCT is to provide financial help to the **economically disabled students who excel in academics** and have a strong desire in pursuing higher education, with no bar on their caste, religion or gender. To date, the Trust has awarded **347 scholarships** worth Rs. 11,77,426/- (\$26,000 USD) for students under the **Educational Scholarship Program**.

EDUCATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM (ESP) - 2009

There were 107 fresh applications received in total out of which 55 were short listed and interviewed. This year's interview panel consisted of PCT Secretary, Education Program Lead, A retired Head Master and a retired teacher.

Total Scholarships awarded: 54 - Total Amount Distributed: Rs. 2,27,500/- (\$5100 USD)

1. Introductory Talk by PCT Founder & President (*Suryaprasad Padala*)



"PCT was established in 2002 with a modest goal of encouraging brilliance among the poor AND to participate in the village development activities in a small way. Our selection process for the scholarship is very thorough. To make sure we select only the most deserving, we have introduced a process called EVR (Eligibility Verification Report) which happens after the applicant and parent/guardian are interviewed by the selection panel. In this process, the applicant's genuineness and his/her family's need for help is judged. *(Please refer to*

Though we usually accept applications from the residents of East Godavari District, we do consider applications from other areas as well provided the applicant is most deserving and in a need-help-desperately situation.

Our only request to all the scholars today is - when you settle in your life, please remember your own past and try to pay it forward by helping the other needy people you come across. If I had forgotten my past, PCT wouldn't have been here today to help you. We want each one of you to help as many needy people as possible on your way in life and make our society a much better and safer place to live in. We strongly believe the fact that **"Service to humanity is the highest form of worship"**.

2. Speech by PCT scholar Mr. Madhu Naidu Polamarasetti

Mr. Madhu Naidu is from a small village called Peddapalli, has been a PCT scholar since 2006 and has completed Intermediate Course with 91% and scored 4000 rank in EAMCET. In his talk, he



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shared with the other scholars and guests how PCT made a difference in his life by helping with this Intermediate course.

3. **Speeches by PCT scholars Mr. Durga Rao Gopi (2nd B.Tech) & Mr. Sudhir Davala (2nd MBBS)**

Both these scholars have mentioned how PCT came forward to help them out when they were stuck with no other option to look for. They both have promised openly that they would devote most of their time in future for helping the other needy around them.

4. **Speech by Guest of Honour Shri K.Ramana, DyEO**

In his short speech, Shri Ramana mentioned that he has known PCT and its activities for last couple of years. He was actually the chief guest at the same event last year (2007). He also sponsored Rs. 10,000/- (Ten Thousand Rupees) towards the Educational Scholarship Program at PCT.

6. **Speeches by Special Guests Shri Tummuri Ramana & Shri N.Gopala Krishna of Tatiparty Village**



Shri Tummuri Ramana (Founder president of Tummuri Shanthi Memorial Services, Tatiparty, E.G.Dist, AP) and Shri Nulu Gopala Krishna (Founder president of Nulu Charitable Trust, Tatiparty, E.G.Dist, AP) are very well known to the villagers of Tatiparty for all the selfless services they’ve been extending to the schools, children, hospitals and elderly people in the village. Both have explained the kind of services they’ve been providing to the needy people in and around their village.

Shri Ramana has shared with the scholars how he got connected to PCT and to his brother Suryaprasad first time 9 months back after hearing from his colleague Shri Mohan Ram of HAF (Humanitarian Aid Foundation, Hyderabad).

Shri Gopala Krishna mentioned that it was the people at PCT who inspired him to expedite the process of registering his trust (NCT) and start its activities from this year onwards.

7. **Inspiring Speech by PCT alumni Ms. Padmavathi Thota, Software Trainee at Cognizant Technology Solutions, Chennai**
